Getting to the Root of Challenging Behavior: Developing the Foundations for Social and Emotional Competence in Children

Nashville State Community College is offering a one week on-campus three credit hour course related to social and emotional development in children. This summer course may be used for teacher license renewal or as an elective in early childhood and education degree or certificate programs.

Nashville State is offering this course in conjunction with Team Tennessee's partnership with the Center on the Social and Emotional Foundations of Early Learning (CSEFEL), and is aligning the curriculum with the evidence-based practices affiliated with CSEFEL.



EDUC-2003-101 Special Topics in Education: Getting to the Root of Challenging Behavior: Developing the Foundations for Social and Emotional Competence in Children

Course Specifics:

- The first class convenes on Monday, June 8th at 9:00 a.m.
- Class will meet Monday through Friday from 9 a.m. to 4 p.m. with a working lunch on campus.
- Log into course beginning May 30 for pre-reading assignments.
- Follow-up assignments, ten virtual hours, and a final project must be completed by July 2 in order to earn college credit.
- A textbook is not required. Course materials will be accessed online.
- Course content will include readings, videos, class discussion, group work and practical application of strategies and concepts.
- Materials for implementation will be developed so that teachers exit the course with hands-on activities and props to use in the classroom.
- Focus will be on children at the preschool and elementary level.



This is a 3 hour credit course approved by the Department of Education for license renewal.

To Register:

1. Apply to NSCC as a **non-degree seeking, transient student**. [This allows you to be admitted to NSCC without having to submit transcripts from high school or college.] The application is found online at www.nsc.edu. To get to the application from NSCC's homepage, go to the menu bar on the left hand side of the page. From the menu bar, click "Students", then click on "Admissions" and finally "Apply Online." Follow the instructions for application submission including creating a new account if you have not been a previous NSCC student. (NOTE: *The last day to submit applications for summer courses is **May 24** for online applications and **May 29** with a paper copy.*) A \$5 nonrefundable fee is required with the application.
2. Once admitted to the college, register for EDUC 2003-101 Special Topics in Education CRN# 50810. *Registration period is from **April 6 through May 28**.*
3. Tuition and fees must be paid by **May 28**. Visit the Student section of the NSCC website for fees and payment information. (Roughly \$356 instate tuition for the 3 hour course.)
